Every Catholic should make every effort to be present for Mass and ceremonies on these Holy Days.

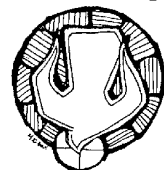
There will be no Mass at 5:30pm on Holy Saturday, Mass will be at 8:30pm.

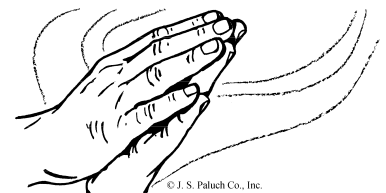
